

ZIMBABWE SECONDARY BURSARY FUND

Supporting Gifted Students through Secondary School

Over 700 students have been supported through secondary school by the **Zimbabwe Secondary Bursary Fund**, run by Zimbabwean Friends and supported by British Quakers for over fifty years. The need is huge – the scheme helps really promising students who would otherwise have to drop out after primary school.

Putting the scheme on a firm footing is a major fundraising focus this year for Friends of Hlekweni, who have taken over the British end of the scheme from QPSW. **Can you help us establish a strong funding base for the scheme to flourish?**

Last year, there were five students being supported by the Secondary Bursary Fund and in 2016 we are supporting twelve. They are selected locally by Zimbabwean Friends based in Bulawayo who carefully monitor the progress of each student on the scheme. The majority of students in Zimbabwe drop out of education at, or even before, the end of primary education usually not for lack of ability but simple poverty.

Sanitary wear scheme

Girls often miss out on their education because of the lack of sanitary wear which is why we have also embarked on a scheme to provide our link schools with a supply of re-usable sanitary towels made locally from recycled materials.

Marvellous comes from a single parent family of five children living in a single room servants' quarters where her mother is a domestic worker. Marvellous is now in Form Three at Langham Girls Boarding School, Harare and is thriving. She relishes the challenge of competition at a level she never had in Primary School and is near the top of her class. It is reported that she is 'a committed high flier'.

How your donation can help:

It costs about £1000 to fund one student in secondary boarding school for a year (most students have to board, often weekly, because of the distances from their homes and poor transport).

£20 supports an orphan child in primary school for one term. 7p per day pays for a nutritious food supplement for a child at one of the schools supported by Friends of Hlekweni.

£3.50 buys a pack of washable sanitary pads to keep a girl at school all through the month.

Schools are also places of social learning. That is why we are working on the introduction of peace education into the curriculum and extracurricular activities.

We continue to support Samathonga School on the site of the former Hlekweni Rural Training Centre. We are also working with three more schools in needy areas around Bulawayo.

SEVERE DROUGHT FORECAST

Zimbabweans across the country, but especially in the driest parts which include Matabeleland, are facing a very difficult year as a result of the severe drought. As one of our contacts put it, "This year looks disastrous in terms of rains. We could face the most crippling drought experienced in recent times." Children are arriving at school hungry and in danger of serious malnutrition.
